CORRUPTION AND ITS IMPACT ON SOCIETY





Developments meant for some villages are found in the houses of the concerned contractors and ministers. Now a days, it is very difficult to get a


job without bribing the higher authorities with a pretty ~~or~~ sum of money. Government offices cannot be dealt with easily unless they are given money for their noon-lunch.
